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Glossary of Terms

<u>Fiscal Sponsorship</u>: Refers to the practice of non-profit organisations offering their legal and tax-exempt status to groups—typically projects—engaged in activities related to the sponsoring organisation's mission. It typically involves a fee-based contractual arrangement between a project and an established non-profit.

<u>Non-Profit Organisation</u>: A legal entity organised and operated for a collective, public or social benefit, in contrast with an entity that operates as a business aiming to generate a profit for its owners.

<u>501(c)(3) Organisation</u>: a United States corporation, trust, unincorporated association or other type of organisation exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of Title 26 of the United States Code.
